School Attendance - Every Day Counts

We all want our students to get a great education and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day. Missing school can have a major impact on a child's future. A student missing a day a fortnight will miss four full weeks by the end of the year. By year 10 they will have missed more than a year of school.

In 2015 the College has increased the minimum attendance requirements to 90%. Please ensure that you notify the College of any absences. This can be done in a number of ways.

- Send a note to the front office
- Phone the College
- Notify GP teacher or Year Level Coordinators via email, in person or phone.

Leaving the school grounds

We have a duty of care to know where students are at all times. Students must seek permission to leave the grounds at any time during the school day, including lunch time or recess break. Any student who wishes to leave the grounds, for any reason, MUST bring a note from home (signed by their parent/guardian). If they are attending an appointment or on business that cannot be carried out in lunch time, they should take their explanatory note to their Year Level Coordinator or Assistant Principal.

Students wishing to leave during the day even if it is to go home for lunch, must receive a Pass from the Year Level Coordinator or Assistant Principals and have both their note and form signed by the Year Level Coordinator. Once the Building works are complete exit and entry via Woodland and Brockley Streets during the school day will be accessed using your student ID card
