Australia National University to look beyond the ATAR score as a sole measure of admission:

Within the next few years, Australia National University will completely revamp its admission processes and move away from just considering the ATAR in the selection process. The University will take into consideration the 'whole person' and also consider factors such as community service, leadership, and co-curricular activities at school. Students will also be able to apply for courses, accommodation and scholarships at the same time.

National Science and Engineering Summer School for Indigenous Students: This program is being run by the Australia National University and Tjabal Indigenous Higher Education Centre. This week long Summer School is for 20 current Year 10 and 11 Indigenous students from across Australia who are interested in science, technology, engineering and mathematics.
