Melbourne Japanese Festival

Students travelled to Melbourne to participate in the Japanese Summer Festival. An early rise to catch the train saw the students soon playing UNO aboard the train and sharing their knowledge of the Japanese culture with fellow passengers. Arriving at Federation square students were introduced to a variety of vocabulary that came up as we saw things or needed directions. Students enjoyed eating yakitori, watching a variety of performances including shamisen (traditional Japanese 3 stringed banjo-type instrument), Taiko (drums) and both traditional obon dancing (done during Obon which is a Japanese Buddhist custom to honour the spirits of one's ancestors) and modern dance groups performing popular Japanese and western tunes. There were a variety of stalls selling kanji fans and prints, dolls for the recent Hina Matsuri festival (also called Doll's Day or Girls' Day, a special day in Japan. Celebrated each year on March 3rd.)
