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Dare to Dream Workshop

On Thursday the 5th of November, fourty-five Wodonga Senior Secondary College students attended a Dare to Dream Entrepreneurial Workshop at Latrobe University in partnership with Project Gen Z.

The first motivational speaker was Ben Pettingill who spoke about the concept of 'limitless vision' and how you should not let your limits stop you from achieving your goals. Ben has a rare genetic condition (Lebers Hereditary Optic Neuropathy), and he is 98% blind. The second guest speaker was Liz Volpe, one of Australia's most prominent female entrepreneurs. Liz shared with us her experiences and goals leaving us with an empowering message to 'just say YES and learn how to do it later'. Before she came to Australia, she lived in a caravan and was working four jobs on top of completing high school.

The group activity was called 'The Apprentice Challenge'. This challenge required teams to create a company and allocate roles of responsibility such as CEO, CFO, the Marketing team, Production, and the Sales Presenter. The brief was to sell Project Gen Z pens. For this task, a 30-second advert, a logo, a slogan, a name for the object and company and short a sales pitch was required. This workshop was a great experience and loads of fun. It pushed everyone out of their comfort zones (teams were chosen at random) and helped students explore their inner creativity. If given the opportunity to do this workshop again, we would definitely recommend it to others
