Study Skills

With Year 10 and 11 students about to begin their end of year exams, we have prepared three tips to assist with the study process.

<u>Gather Materials</u> - Do you have any notes, textbooks, past tests or reading that you think will be relevant to your end of year exams. These will help jog your memory of the content covered and by reading passages from these you may be reminded of the areas of the course that you are less familiar with or require additional help with.

<u>Make a Plan</u> - The exams are fast approaching which means that you have limited to left to study for them, so you need to make the most of it, divide up your study time amongst the subjects that you have and decide if you need to spend more time working on one subject over another.

<u>Create Study Notes</u> - Create a set of summary notes that summarise your learning of the subject, paying more attention to the content that you are less farmiliar with and target them to the content specifically covered in the exams.
